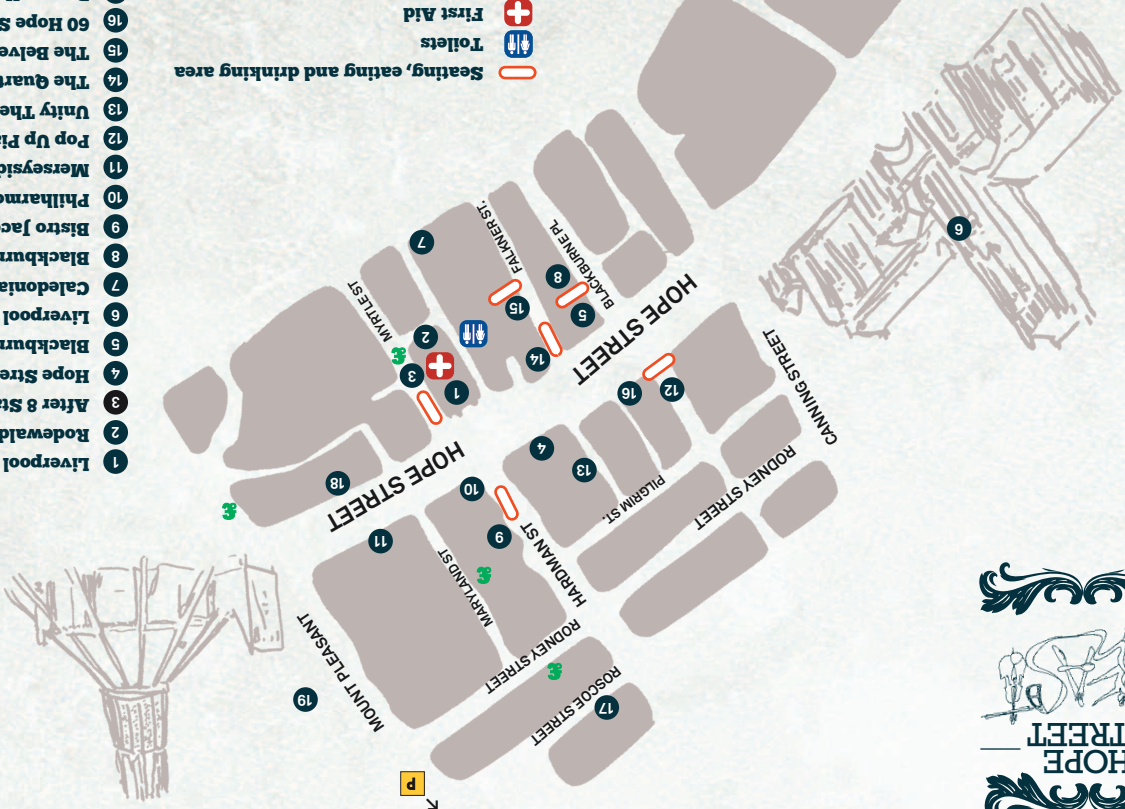

Leon Pearce BHS

Alun Parry A8

Alun is an English folk singer/songwriter and community music festival organiser. Known for his slice of life lyrics and punchy performance style Parry often weaves social commentary into his tales, and political songs.

Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra LPA

The UK's oldest professional symphony orchestra. Under the baton of Chief Conductor Vasily Petrenko, the Orchestra has built a global reputation for excellence for their concerts, recordings and broadcasts in Liverpool, across the UK and internationally.

Ian Prowse LPA, HSH

Merseyside singer /songwriter, founder and front man of Pele who now fronts the band Amsterdam. His carrer retrospective 'Does This Train Stop in Merseyside' was released to great acclaim earlier this year. Ian is an ever present in all three Irish Seas Sessions.

Matthew Reekie HSH

Liverpool singer songwriter who's acclaimed EP 'Down the Corridors' was released in June.

Rhos Orpheus Welsh Male Choir LPA

The Rhos Orpheus Male Choir (Cor Meibion Orffwys y Rhos) from the village of Rhosllanerchrugog has been described as one of the finest male voice choirs in Wales. They will showcase a selection of favourites from the male voice repertoire, some well known Welsh pieces, spirituals and songs from the shows.

Pauline Scanlon LPA, A8

As featured vocalist with the Sharon Shannon Band for three years, and as a solo artist, Scanlon has entranced audiences the world over. Deeply immersed in the tradition yet completely aware , she is capable of making the oldest ballads sound immediate and fresh while granting newer material a timeless resonance.

Tom Seals BHS

This 19-year old virtuoso jass pop pianist has worked with Grammy Award winner Cleo Laine, Mr. 'Amarillo' Tony Christie, Jason Donovan and Darius just to name a few.

Rachel Sermanni A8

A straight-up storyteller with a voice to blow many others clean out of the water...the 20- year-old Scottish singer-songwriter packs an almighty punch with her earthy folk melodies and dextrous fingerpicking.

SianT BHS

A singer/songwriter who describes her genre as Soul/Pop, but is strongly influenced by a wide range of music

Ady Suleiman BHS

A singer songwriter with a refreshing unique voice and sound influenced by jazz, soul, reggae and hip hop.

West Everton Super Strings LPA

WESS are young musicians are aged 11 – 13 years, and are one of a number of ensembles that have emerged out of West Everton Children's Orchestra, which was established in 2009 though Liverpool Philharmonic's In Harmony programme.
